

Creating a Great Day Service Scavenger Hunt



Rules:

1. Determine how many "Scavenger Service Projects" need to be completed to win. Ex: 5 out of 10
2. Split up into groups as close to even as possible.
3. Each group gets to choose which projects they will complete.
4. Make sure each group has a phone that takes pictures and can connect to others.
5. Create a way to communicate with the other groups. This could be via messenger, text, email, Instagram, whatever. There are so many options, but make sure you all use the same form of communication so that you can do the next step.
6. Before heading out, pray for your service to glorify God and that He will put people in your path who are needing some extra love from Him today.
7. Upon completing a task, take a picture and send it out to the entire group, as proof that you have completed your task. Use hashtags
 - **#ServiceScavengerHunt**
 - **#CaGD** (for Creating a Great Day so we can cheer you on too)
 - Create a fun # for your group
8. Be sure to let whomever you are serving know why you are doing it. Yes, it's fun, but it's more about taking the time to love them because Jesus loves them! And don't forget to thank them for letting you serve them. If the person you choose to serve isn't home, leave a note for them.
9. Once you've completed all your projects, send the final picture and meet up at a predetermined location to celebrate together once all the teams have finished and return. Maybe have a cookout and ice cream with some praise and worship thrown into the mix. Feel free to even invite the people you have served to join you in your celebration.



Here are Creating a Great Day's Service Scavenger Hunt Ideas:

- Go to a local laundromat. Pay for someone's wash and dry or help fold clothes.
- Find a policeman or fireman and ask if you can pray over them for their protection and thank them for their service.
- Find the following items in your house and send them to the Syrian refugees:
 - A. Sneakers
 - B. Gym shoes for men, women & children (all sizes) are HIGH Priority
 - C. Sweatpants of all sizes
 - D. Briefs/underwear for men, women and children (all sizes)
 - E. Men's trousers (small, medium & large) and shoes
 - F. Baby powder milk
 - G. Any non-perishables like nut butters or other long-lasting foods
 - H. Diapers
 - I. Feminine products
 - J. Sleeping bags
 - K. Plastic to cover the floor/for shade
 - L. Tents/tarpaulin
 - M. Mats (camping or yoga mats)
 - N. Hats & caps for sunshade (adult & children/light colors because of the sun)
 - O. Electric Plug for multiple devices (European voltage)
- Walk a residential street and ask the available houses, if they have anything on the list above that they would like to donate to the Syrian refugees.
- Mow someone's yard.
- Take flowers to a shut-in or widow.
- Go to a retirement home and sing two songs or provide some sort of entertainment to those in the waiting area.
- Drop off a bag of diapers at a new parent's home.
- Hold a sign up on a street corner that says, "Will pray for you, if you ask! God Bless" and stand there for at least 10 minutes.
- Go to a gas station and clean at least 3 car windshields.
- Go to a local store like Wal-Mart, Target, Sams, Costco, etc and offer to take their cart back to the front for them. (Offer to at least 10 people.)
- Have everybody in the group write a note to a friend they haven't seen or talked to in a while and mail the letters.
- Pick weeds out of a flower bed or front yard.
- Rake leaves.
